On the May 13, Chloe McWalter Bar Manager at the Dennington Queen, completed a Wing Walk for Parkinson's UK. Chloe knows

several people locally with the disease and wanted a challenge that pushed her skills. Parkinson's is a degenerative neurological condition: It affects 127,000 people in the UK- that's 1 in 500 of the population and currently there is no cure.

Chloe said 'On the journey to Upminster, where the Wing Walk took place, the nerves started to kick in but in the back of my mind, I was thinking of the achievement I would feel from completing the Wing Walk. After a 15-minute briefing, it was my time to fly. Although the Wing Walk was mildly terrifying when experiencing challenging manoeuvres, with speeds up to 120mph and heights up to 1,200 feet, I saw Canary Wharf, the Thames and many other London landmarks, which made it a once in a life time experience'.

The cost is £12 per year with 4 prizes being awarded each month, £25, £15, £10, and a lower amount of £2 which can change depending on the number of participants.

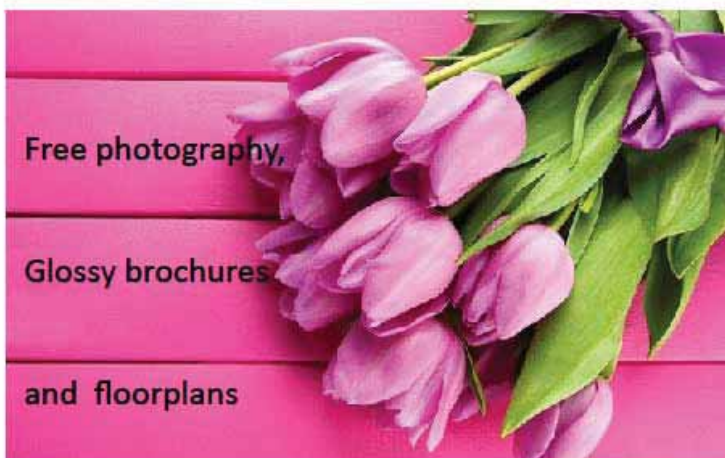
This is a vital contribution to the hall running costs as 50% of contributions are returned to the hall.

of Suffolk. It was started by Frances Boscawen in 2013, when her love of flowers, gardening and particularly of using seasonal flowers in her bouquets and arrangements, left her thinking about their origin (Holland, Kenya and South America). We have all become aware of food miles, now is a chance to

cut our flower miles too. With plenty of space at Moat Farm, the obvious answer was to start growing an ever expanding range of flowers ourselves. So the sheltered vegetable garden has been turned over to tulips, larkspur and

peonies, the crumbling red bricks and cracked concrete of the old cattle yard have been transformed into a cutting garden bursting with annuals and dahlias in raised beds, and the one-time pony paddock has been planted for full-scale flower production.

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# Fallow Deer...

I would like to cover Fallow Deer this issue, I covered Red Deer last year, and the Fallow size wise come between the Reds and the Roe (of course if we take into consideration the Muntjac and the ever increasing Chinese water deer) that alters the perspective size wise!

The fallow were first introduced to Britain during the Roman period, however when the Roman Empire collapsed the fallow became extinct, it was not until the 11<sup>th</sup> century that the fallow deer were re-introduced, they are now seen in large numbers within this country and indeed this immediate area, I love the long slender necks of the fallow, the many varied coat colours and patterns and the odd "paddle" like antlers...



The main colour of the fallow is the fawn colouring with traditional white spots,...the Menil variety is a paler version of this omitting the black bordered rump and keeping its white spots all year round.

We also have the black variety (Melanistic) there is no white found on the deer at all, and lastly the white variety, which ranges from cream to white....reaching its white form by adulthood....a true "white Hart"



The rut follows closely behind the Red Deer rut, and they are no more tolerant toward unwanted company than the Reds, the call of the fallow is different to that of the rutting Red...I always think more like a pigs

grunting noise...unmistakable, they will graze the same habitat as Reds and you will see herds of fallow mingling with the larger Red Deer, even during the rut they will be tolerated in fairly close contact only getting chased by the Red Stags if they find themselves in-between the rutting stag and his hinds.



Once the hinds have dropped their fawns, they will leave them alone for periods of time whilst going off to feed, the young fawns are perfectly safe, they lie still and the mother knows where to find her offspring, Unfortunately there have been a number of young fawns lifted and taken to wildlife sanctuaries this year

so far as the public believe they have been abandoned....THEY HAVE NOT...PLEASE NEVER REMOVE A FAWN FROM ITS RESTING PLACE...if you ever have any enquiries regarding wildlife safety or welfare either drop me a line or leave me a message on 01728 638802 [email: bevandjim@live.co.uk](mailto:bevandjim@live.co.uk)

A good place to view the Fallow Deer are in Deer Parks, this does not mean they are tame, far from it, but are kept as park deer usually for Deer Farming, but not always.....Helmingham Hall have a nice herd, as do Holkham Hall.... however please stay on the allocated footpaths!

I myself prefer to make things difficult for myself and go out looking for wild free Fallow!!

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## Village Personalities: Carol Sheward

Born in Witney, Oxfordshire, Carol moved to London at 3 weeks, her father working for the British Oxygen Company, in Wembley. The family lived in Maida Vale. Carol's favourite aunt moved to Yoxford to run a general store and Carol first came to Suffolk as a young girl, in her holidays, falling in love with the countryside. She used to hide when her mother came to pick her up at the end of the vacations, for she wanted to stay: the woods, fields, trees and streams were her most intense childhood pleasures.



Carol left school like many teenagers, unsure of what she wanted to do in life. Her chief interests were in acting and with animals. She wrote to the B.B.C. and was lucky enough to be accepted for their year long studio managers' training course, especially interested in drama and light entertainment, based at Broadcasting House.

From here, Carol went into radio drama, which she loved, and she got to meet some of the stars of the time: Ralph Richardson, Michael Redgrave, Judi Dench, Derek Jacobi and Dirk Bogarde. It was an exciting place to be for a young lady and she developed her career from doing studio sound effects with the actors, to running the sound mixing desk for final broadcast productions. Carol married Ian, who also worked for the B.B.C. in television drama; they left together in 1993. She'd been with the 'Beeb' 30 years to the day, August 26th and experienced many changes during that

time, particularly in the mood and relationship to employees within the Corporation. For some time, Carol had been considering a career change; she took voluntary redundancy in advance of a much larger exodus of studio managers, knowing that her first love was with animals.

Carol went to an open day at an RSPCA centre in Shepherd's Bush. A month's voluntary work followed and, thereafter, a 6 month placement as an animal care assistant. Both Carol and Ian by now wished to get out of London, Carol to return to her 'spiritual home' in Suffolk. They initially rented in Leiston, before finding their dream house on the edge of Dennington, which came with a tree growing through the lounge floor at their time of purchase! A carefully manicured hole in the hedge allowed a view over fields to St. Mary's from the bedroom; the bells and peacocks are always clearly heard.

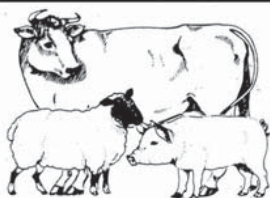
Whilst Ian continued to commute, Carol worked as a nurse at Castle Vets and subsequently joined the Framlingham and Saxmundham branch of Cats' Protection as their Homing Officer. Like all other volunteers, she works from home as their Microchip and Neutering Officer-Miss 'Chip and Snip'. Carol also fosters some of the 250+ cats and kittens which the branch takes into its care each year and she also helps run their many fund-raising stalls as the charity still runs entirely on voluntary donation.

Carol thoroughly enjoyed her new village life too, helping Anne and Don Keys with the annual village pantomime and drama group, 'Tickled Pink'. Carol did the sound, Ian the sets. Everyone pitched in and what was really 'special' was that so many who had never done any drama before came good on stage when the curtain rose. The shows were always in the village hall. The first, 'Cinderella', performed in February, 2004, was quickly sold out on all nights, a great relief for, at the time, no-one really knew how it might be received. The cast 'started out as a group of strangers and ended up as a bunch of friends'.

Carol also served on the Parish Council for several years and was impressed by how much everybody genuinely cared about village issues, turning out in all weathers to debate and carefully consider local concerns. She has spent considerable time in her garden, designing and manicuring a beautiful, bird-rich landscape, enjoyed by friends and foe alike- hedgehogs and weasels respectively. Other loves are the cinema at Aldeburgh and Leiston (3D), and the theatres: The Wolsey, Theatre Royal, in Norwich and the Suffolk Summer Theatres. The reading of historical and horror novels enrich her evening time, usually with a feline or two in nearby attendance.

# Recording Dennington's History

I would just like to introduce myself to you all as your Local History Recorder for Dennington. The Suffolk Local History Council administers a Local Recorders Scheme throughout Suffolk. The council maintains a network of people in the county to ensure the survival of valuable material for future local historians. The role of a Recorder is to keep an account of activities within the parish, and any changes that take place.

We also research (if we wish) the history of the parish, sometimes with a theme for the year, but more on that in a while!

I have always been fascinated by our local history, all era's, so to



become a volunteer recorder for the parish where I live means a lot to me. We moved into the street just over a year ago from the mid Suffolk area where I voluntarily curated the local airfield museum at Wattisham, close to where I was born. I still help at Wattisham when I can, and now I also serve on the Laxfield and District Museum committee. This museum is located within the historic Guildhall in Laxfield and the chairman is very keen to really make sure the 'AND DISTRICT' is included, and so I hope we can add some Dennington history to the exhibits, Brundish and other parishes that join Laxfield are also becoming involved.

This year I am researching the former shops, trades and businesses of Dennington, also the places where perhaps the local nurse/doctor lived; any year or decade, long ago or recent. I would be so very pleased to hear from if you; if you or your family lived in a former shop and if your property was once the home of a tradesperson. Also, how was Dennington affected by the Second World War? Do you have memories of the village during this time?

I am trying to research the history of our own property; whilst digging our garden to make new flower beds we unearthed a vast amount of old clay pipes, they are literally everywhere! But I had heard that once a weekly market was held in the street, centuries ago. I would love to know more about that too, apparently people travelled several miles to trade in clay pipes in the village, maybe the front our property was where these pipes were traded from? Or maybe the inhabitants simply sat and chatted over a clay pipe after a hard day's graft?!

So, as well as recording what is happening in the here and now, I would love to hear from anyone who has memories of Dennington they would like to share, maybe also photographs and historical information.

Although I love local history, I am relatively new to this village so your help would be greatly appreciated and I would love to talk to you.

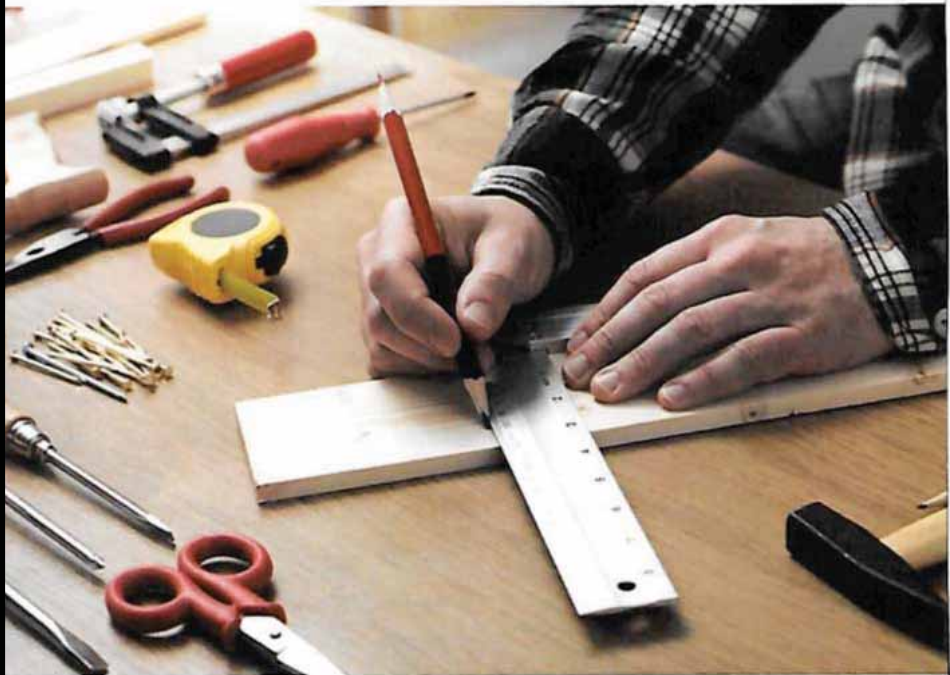
These are exciting projects, but some younger people are needed on the Committee to help generate new ideas and complete projects. At the moment prices are being sourced for different ideas.
