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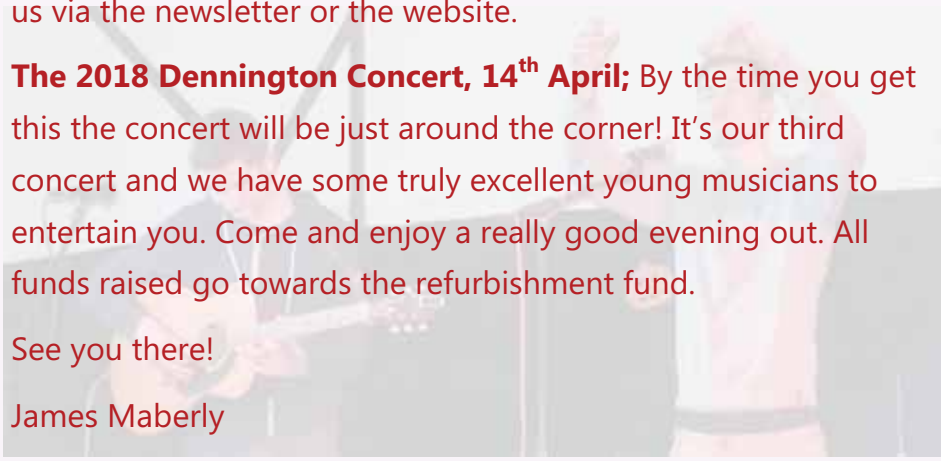

April

I tried some studio work, photographing Tropical Frogs in a set up studio based at a friend's mother's game farm! It proved to be such fun, and a challenge as I had to get used to using a completely different type of camera lens, and exterior flashgun, I would usually use long super telephoto lenses for the wildlife images, but this time I opted for a Macro lens and flash gun....this is a lens used for extreme close up work or tiny subjects.

Mark was swift to instruct us that on no account were we to move an inch if he shouted FROG....that was the alarm to let us know one had left the photography prop and could be anywhere! I do believe if one of us stood on said frog we would not be alive today.....I had become used to these tiny little chaps either landing on my forehead or on the camera lens..



I would love to work with these tiny frogs again, and also Harvest mice, and maybe studio work is a way forward I do not know as yet, one thing I do know my photography must follow the living planet, I am not happy photographing anything else.....unless any kind soul wants to make me a stationary hide on their land!

I hope you enjoy the photograph as much as I did taking them.

Elaine's Cookery Corner

Hello all, it was great to see so many of the villagers come out to support the jumble sale last month. I was their on my Cake stall.. selling some of my cakes as well as some others that people had generously donated. I am very much a keen baker so I thought we'd do something simple this time in a vanilla cupcake. Hope you give it a go.

Vanilla cupcakes.

175 g butter (at room temperature), cut into large pieces

175 g self-raising flour

175 g caster sugar

1/2 tsp baking powder

1/2 tsp vanilla extract

3 large eggs

1 tbs milk

FOR THE ICING:

175 g butter, room temperature

1 tsp vanilla extract

2-3 tbs milk

350 g icing sugar, sifted

Makes 12 cupcakes

Pre heat oven to 180 degrees.



Cream together the butter and caster sugar until light and fluffy. Gradually add eggs whilst beating (if for any reason the mixture curdles you can add a tablespoon of flour before adding the rest of the eggs. Fold in flour and baking powder then add the vanilla extract and milk. Evenly distribute mixture into 12 cupcake cases within cupcake tin and put into the oven for around 20 mins.

To get the best buttercream use good quite unsalted butter (my favourite it president butter) another good tip is to beat the butter for 5/10 mins this give a really light butter cream. Add the icing sugar gradually and beat for 2 mins whilst adding vanilla extract and milk. I put my mixture into a piping bag with an open star nozzle and only once the cupcakes are fully cooled do I pipe the buttercream onto the cupcake.

To decorate I add a chocolate flake.....Enjoy

Dennington Parish Council

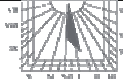
As you know, over recent months the Parish Council has been liaising with Highways and the District Council on road repairs and the infamous potholes. We hope to see some action soon.

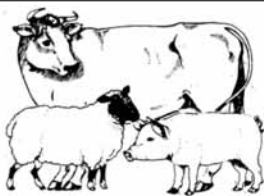

Village Personalities: Andrew Smith

Andrew grew up with his parents in Maypole Green until 11, and has a brother, Marcus, now foreman at Dennington Hall Farms, and sisters, Julie, now living in Owl's Green and Lynn, in Ipswich. He later moved to Bruisyard, when father Michael became foreman for Major Rous at Dennington Hall. Andrew went to Dennington Primary School and then Thomas Mills. The Primary only had two



teachers then and no grass playing field, as it now boasts. Andrew was the milk monitor which meant he put the milk, in the colder winter months, on the school radiators to thaw them out! Sometime a member of Dennington Church Choir in 1969 under the stewardship of pianist, Miss Olive Steward, he left school early at 15 for an apprenticeship with Albert Lain, 9 years in total, at a woodworking business in Rendham. He had 3 years of day release to Ipswich College to complete a cabinet makers' course for his City and Guilds qualification. The Full Technical Certificate

followed, Andrew now 21 and married that year to Sandra, a nurse at Ipswich Hospital. They initially lived in Wood Farm Cottages on the Dennington Road and then moved back, in Andrew's case, to Bruisyard. Andrew did star in one cameo role for the Dennington cricket team around this time, playing on today's village football ground; he has enjoyed coarse fishing with the Framlingham Anglers.

From 1982, Andrew joined 'Barleywood' in Peasenhall at the old Smythe Drill Works with general woodworking, but especially pieces for schools' use. He briefly taught at his former secondary school too. In 1994 Andrew became self-employed and was sub-contracted to 'Finewood' at Rendham, making Mendlesham chairs and other, bespoke furniture. He made the frames for the bells at both Dennington and Rendham churches. In 2010, he joined 'Treeincarnated', founded by Jeremy Lain, the son of Albert. The premises was, and still is, at Lodge Farm on the Rous estate. The company continue to makMendlesham chairs and unique furniture and do furniture repairs.

They also offer quality hardwood timber to those interested in making their own pieces, with wood selectively sourced locally.

Mendlesham chairs are traditionally of elm (a wide single piece) and cherry wood, the elm for the seat, the cherry for the curved frame. Other fruit woods can, alternatively, be used. Larger elms are rare to come by today, and are individually purchased in whole or in part. 'Treeincarnated' clients



are international in nature, and include Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, whose chair Andrew made with the carved royal cipher. Lord Tollemache has one too with his family crest. Each piece is dated and numbered and the firm keep a list of all previous clients. About 20-25 are made annually, with a starting price of £1200. They require at least 60 hours of specialised man labour each. As far as we know, 'Treeincarnated' are the only commercially producing company of their kind in the world. Today, these made-to-measure chairs are tailored to suit individual size and design specification. There is a 'Dennington Size', first modelled for our past vicar, Jonathan Olunczuk, a man of generous proportion! Original chairs, made in Mendlesham village in the early part of the 19th century, were of smaller dimension. Generation of new orders comes almost exclusively by word of mouth and from rural show and craft fair orders. They are often personalised for special occasions with hand carving and inscribed to fit purpose.

'Treeincarnated' also make beds, traditional and contemporary tables including the one at Bruisyard Hall which seats 24, large television and bedside cabinets, display units, jewellery boxes and veneered storage boxes. The company last year repaired the church latch and restored the village seat in the square, putting new posts around the commemorative oak tree behind. 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Philip de Whalley. 1923- 2017

Philip was born in Croydon in 1923 as a twin to Graham and after wartime service in the Royal Navy in Destroyers and then MTBs, he trained as a science teacher arriving at Framlingham College in 1956. He became Housemaster of Garret and Head of Science. In 1969 he married June. Theirs has been an inspirational marriage and while this piece is about Philip, June and he worked closely together on the many tasks that they shared. A real team.

They moved to Bell House in Owls Green, Dennington in 1977 with a 7 year old Simon. Worshipping at Dennington Church, Philip and June were delighted to be involved in village life. Both joined the PCC with Philip becoming Treasurer and , on Maurice Steward's sudden death in 1979, he was elected Churchwarden. This was the commencement of 22 years of commitment until passing the baton on to Lisbeth Jensen in 2001. During these years, Philip worked with 5 Priests and kept things going in 3 inter-regnums with the creation of a new benefice under Andrew Turner and some major Church repairs in 1982 along with the every day work as Churchwarden. The green bicycle would be seen peddling in from Owls Green to put up the flag (85 tower steps) for Saint's days, and while initially helped by Hubert Taylor as verger, after his death Philip, often helped by June, would prepare the Church for services. His handyman skills were put to constant use- repairing the hanging Pyx, making a wooden altar cross, reading lectern, sand table repairs and many other small but important touches.

Philip lived a truly Christian life - by example- in his kindness, thoughtfulness for others, patience and support. So many people have benefited from knowing him. He helped the youth club and from David Kittermaster's retirement in 1980 until Bill Blakely took over in 1998 he was clerk to the Dennington charity, becoming Trustee as well until 2008. Under his guidance with his attention to detail, the charity sold the old village hall land, reinvesting in the new hall, he persuaded the charity commission to continue to allow the practice of Christmas grants which he helped to arrange and with Jill Heffer made sure that those in need in the village were cared for. After moving to Framlingham , Philip and June continued to worship at Dennington and it was lovely to have them with Simon and Christina and the grand children at Church.

We have been privileged to have had such a special person in our village and this was acknowledged by the wonderful attendance at his funeral , where by his special request, the old village bier was brought out of retirement to bear his coffin. It is so typical of Philip to have wanted this - a touch of humour but also fondness for tradition and for the treasures that he had cared for. There is so much that I have not mentioned but we will all have our special memories of Philip to treasure.

Sadly Carol Sheward died in December 2017 she was a keen supporter of Cats Protection and kept us well informed. Carol will be missed by all.

Beehive charity—what is it?

The charity is dedicated to transforming the lives of vulnerable young mothers, many of whom are orphans themselves, providing them with an education and teaching them life skills as well as giving their babies an education once they reach the appropriate age; all within a loving, caring and stable environment. Any money raised from the event will be used for the running of the Beehive: rent, utility bills, food, wages for staff, medical & health care, education fees and living costs for the girls and babies.
